Teen Reviewers and Critics (TRaC) Intern

The Summer Teen Reviewers and Critics Program (TRaC) is a free 4-week program for high school students from all over New York and New Jersey to explore the arts in NYC while expanding critical thinking and writing skills. The TRaC Summer Intern will collaborate with the TRaC Program Manager to gain valuable skills, knowledge, and hands-on experience in arts education and administration. Duties include, but are not limited to:

- Schedule and assist with orientations for TRaC program participants
- Complete administrative tasks in support of the TRaC program including but not limited to data entry, copying, and filing
- Assist teaching artist during workshops and field trips to arts events
- Write and edit responses to arts experiences
- Contribute to creating a welcoming and inclusive environment for teen participants,
 staff and interns

The Arts Administration Intern provides administrative support for a diverse portfolio of teen programs including the Teen Reviewers and Critics Program and Pizza and a Movie Night Bronx Summer Series. Duties include, but are not limited to:

- Data entry and developing reports on teen experiences in programs;
- Assisting with digital marketing efforts and promotional events;
- Updating digital and paper archives;
- Maintenance of the teen blog, The Journal of Art and Reviews;
- Organizing materials and supplies for teen participants;
- Contribute to creating a welcoming and inclusive environment for teen participants, staff and interns
